PROCEDURES

- All Enforcement Sheets and Qualification Sheets are due no later than Sunday, April
 7th, 2024. These forms must be emailed to Parker Weber and Lorelai Lindon at pweber@usci.org, and president@chusy.org.
- 2. The personal statement in the Qualification Sheet may not exceed 150 words.
- 3. Any false information will automatically **eliminate** the applicant from eligibility to run for a Regional Office.
- All potential candidates and at least one of their parents/guardians must attend one of the Candidate & Parent/Guardian Information Meetings either Wednesday April 10th
 2024 at 5pm or Thursday April 11th at 8pm
- 5. Absolutely no campaigning will be permitted until after applicants are notified of their candidacy. There will be no "vicious" campaigning and no campaigning on Shabbat (and holidays).
- 6. There is a \$15 campaign expense account limit. Any candidate exceeding this limit will forfeit his/her eligibility.
- 7. SPEECHES: All speeches will be given at elections on **Sunday April 14th at 5:00pm**. Candidates for President will give a speech of no more than 5 minutes; all other candidates' speeches will not exceed 3 minutes. No audience participation will be allowed in speeches or nominations.

STANDARDS FOR CANDIDACY

Since the USY Regional Officer is a representative of Conservative Judaism, it is expected that the ideals and principles of our Movement will permeate every facet of his/her life. To be considered for candidacy, a USYer must meet the following minimum standards:

- 1. Have participated in at least 1.5 hours of supervised Judaic studies a month.
 - 1. The region shall help provide opportunities for this study
 - 2. Members are heavily encouraged to utilize the USY International Torah Bytes program to work towards achieving their hour and a half requirement
- 2. Have a reading knowledge of Hebrew, or that the candidate be in the process of acquiring such knowledge
- 3. Have attended at least 75% of all regional programs the year preceding the election
 - 1. Excluding events that the travel time from your place of residence is longer than the event itself;
- 4. Have at least two of the following for at least one term each:
 - 1. Chapter board member
 - 2. Chapter officer
 - 3. Regional general board chairman
- 5. Be in at least their second year of attendance of high school

REQUIREMENTS FOR AN ELECTED OFFICER

Once elected, an officer must have the above-mentioned qualifications throughout their term. In addition, they must:

- Attend 100% regional functions unless otherwise excused by the Regional President or Regional Director
 - a. Excluding events that the travel time from your place of residence is longer than the event itself;
- 2. Observe Kashrut at all times in public, and as much as possible in private.
- Observe the Shabbat and Jewish Holidays with regard to the response of the Rabbinical Assembly pertaining to travel, and by refraining from all school exams and public functions. Exceptions may be made at the discretion of the Regional Teen Engagement Director.
- 4. Participate in a supervised Judaic study program other than USY chapter study for a minimum of 3 hours monthly
- 5. Attend 50% of own chapter functions
- 6. It is expected that officers will make healthy Jewish dating choices.
- 7. Attending a minimum of 2 religious services bi monthly
- 8. Refrain from illegal use of drugs and alcohol.

OFFICER RESPONSIBILITIES

Carefully consider the responsibilities of each office upon declaring your desired position.

A. President

- 1. Shall call and preside over all meetings of the Region.
- 2. Shall serve as official representative of CHUSY to International USY and to all other outside organizations
- 3. Shall report to the Region as to the State of the Region
- 4. Shall serve as a member of all committees
- Shall have the power to make decisions for the Region in time of emergency.
 These decisions must be approved by the Executive Board as a whole within a week.

B. Executive Programming Vice President

- 1. Shall be responsible for all logistics of running the region
- 2. Shall oversee all convention programs, including the planning process of them
- 3. Shall oversee all regional programs
- 4. Shall assist the President and other officers in carrying out their duties
- 5. Shall serve as president, taking all appropriate rights and responsibilities, upon absence or incapability of the President

C. Ruach Vice President

- 1. Shall be responsible for overseeing all program planning for day programs and lounge nights
- 2. Shall be the liaison between the general members of CHUSY to the REB
- 3. Shall assist the President and other officers in carrying out their duties

D. Outreach Vice President

- 1. Shall oversee the outreach of the region
- 2. Shall serve as the official member in welcoming new members
- 3. Shall assist the President and other officers in carrying out their duties

E. Communications Vice President

- 1. Shall keep an accurate record of all meetings of the Region
- 2. Shall issue all correspondence as directed by the President
- 3. Shall have access to and utilize CHUSY social media accounts
- 4. Shall oversee these Regional Board positions: Harakevet, Yearbook, and Regalia, and any other positions the Regional Executive Board sees fit
- 5. Shall assist the President and other officers in carrying out their duties

INTENTION TO DROP DOWN

<u>Do not</u> state this intention on your Qualification Sheet. However, be prepared to declare it at the meeting with the Selection Committee.

For all offices except the Presidency, the President shall ask for any candidates who have been defeated for President or Executive Vice President office if they wish to drop down and run for an office at that announced election time. No one will be allowed to drop down more than once. Each candidate prior to Elections must state their intention to drop down to the current Regional President.
